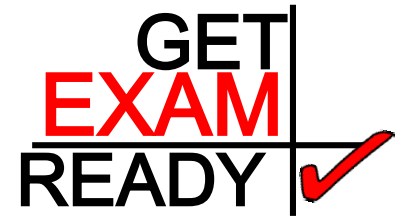

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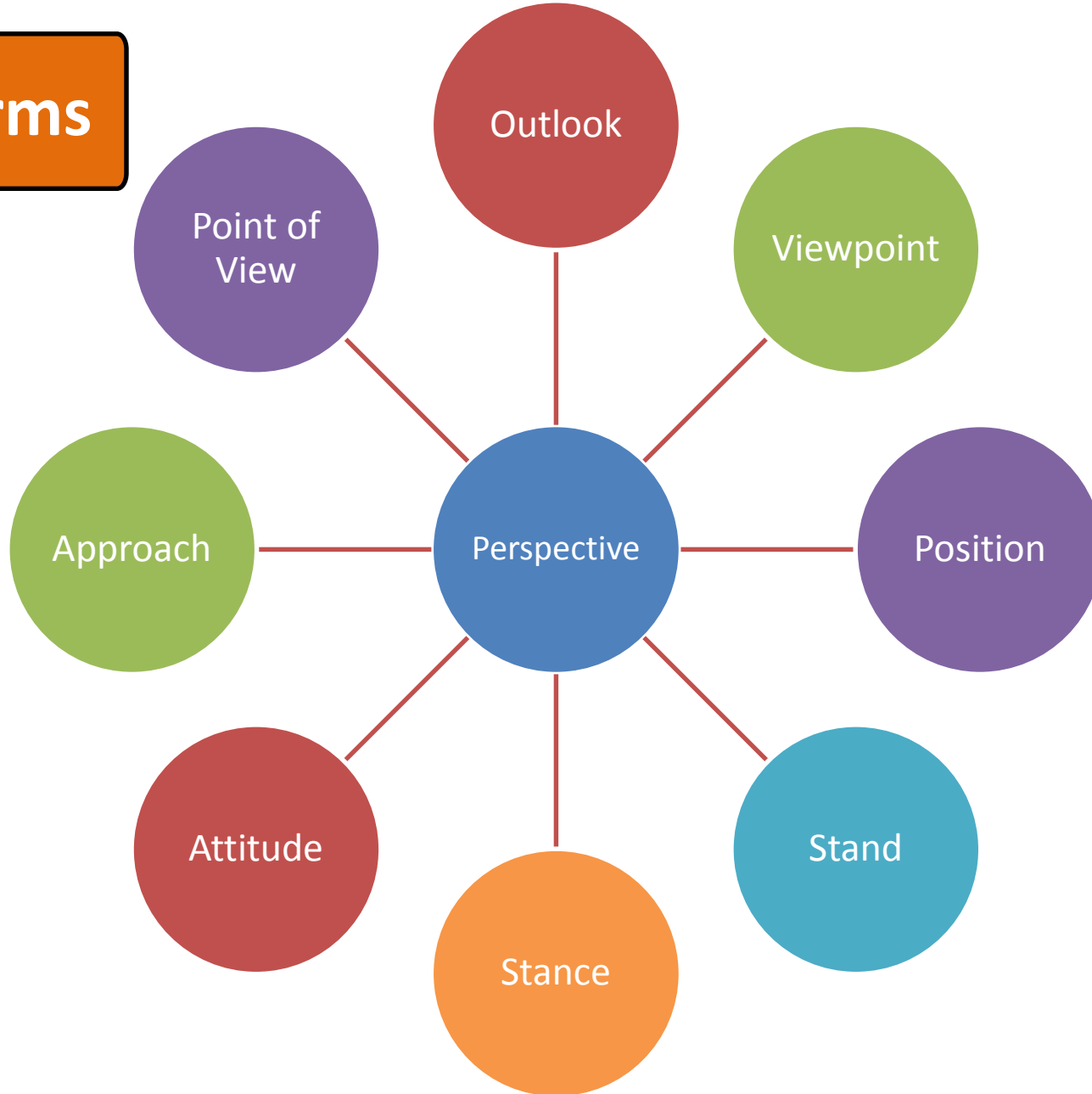

## THE BIGGEST TIPS:

1. When looking at **WHOLE** texts there **MAY** be a changing perspective (from start to finish).

2. The question is always asking you:

i) **WHAT** the writers think

ii) **HOW** do they show what they think

3. This question is **ALL** about **PERSPECTIVE**

(it is **NOT** about close language analysis)

I.E. Talk about imagery in general but you don't have to talk about similes / metaphors etc.

4. How are they influencing you by what they say?

If it helps you CAN say:

**HOW** the writer makes **YOU** feel with what they say...

or even

**HOW** the writer would have made a reader feel at the time the source was published....
