Revision activity Number 1	<p>Mind Maps – Core knowledge & Case Studies.</p> <p><u>Example Hazards:</u> Create a double-sided Mind Map one side is your core knowledge and the other side is your Case Study Information. Use your revision guide or companion guide to take the key areas as your main branches. Then coming off them start adding specific details. E.g. Specific plate margins and what hazards are created at them. Use different colours and small diagrams to help condense your information down. On the other side add your Case studies. Don't spend ages doing a wonderful title at the cost of the actual useful information. Use visual aids like pictures or \$ sign for money.</p> <p>When creating mind maps make sure you use the proper Geographical terminology for example subduction zone and not below.</p> <p>You can then test you have everything down by using your Mind maps to answer exam questions.</p>

Revision activity Number 2	<p>Revision Clocks – Inside your AQA Geography Companion Booklet.</p> <p>Allow yourself sufficient time to thoroughly review a topic or section, taking the time to process and absorb the information. Once you've done so, avoid referencing the material and instead use the revision clock to answer the questions in a sequential manner. This method helps you to consolidate your knowledge and then identify any gaps by revisiting the material afterwards.</p> <p>After you have completed this step take past papers and search for the individual questions about the topic that you can attempt to answer. Your completed answers can be handed to your Geography teacher and it will be marked for you.</p>
