

## CORBY TECHNICAL SCHOOL –COVID-19 BEHAVIOUR POLICY ANNEX

A copy of the Brooke Weston Trust behaviour and discipline policy is also available from our school website. In addition, this policy is to clarify expectations for the re-opening for autumn 2020.

Good behaviour and discipline are key foundations for effective teaching and learning. At Corby Technical School we expect and insist on the highest standards of behaviour throughout our school. It is vital that during these challenging times that students adhere to the following expectations:

- All students must enter and exit the building through their designated entrance.
- Students must sit in the seating plan arranged by their class teacher.
- Mobile phones need to be switched off and out of sight at all times.
- Students must obey social distancing rules at all times, in and out of their year group bubble.
- Use appropriate language at all times.
- Follow instructions from staff.
- Students should stay at their own desk unless directed otherwise by a member of staff.
- Be polite and respectful to staff and other students at all times.
- Students must remain in their classroom unless directed by a member of staff.

It is vital that students follow expected self-care and health needs.

- Wash hands regularly following the guidance, particularly if moving rooms is required.
- Refrain from coughing or spitting at or towards any other person.
- Students must inform a member of staff if they are feeling unwell.
- All students must bring in their own equipment and refrain from lending or borrowing equipment from others.
- Students must not share items or food at any time.
- Students should use tissues when sneezing or coughing and dispose of it in a bin. Students should follow hygiene rules including washing hands when asked to and adopt a 'catch it, bin it, kill it' mentality.

### Sanctions:

Corby Technical School will ensure that expectations during these challenging times is made clear to students and parents at the start of the reopening. The importance of these systems will be explained to the students at the start of Term 1 and reinforced at different times during the school day to ensure all students understand the expectations.

Students will have regular reminders about social distancing expectations and there is signage in all areas around the school to remind students of the importance of social distancing and hygiene to keep safe. Any student who does not follow or respect these expectations will be spoken to by school staff and parent/carers will be informed.

Our normal behaviour procedures will apply for any serious or persistent breaches of our school code of conduct.
