

Corby Technical School – COVID 19 Behaviour Policy Annex (Students attending school)

This annex to the Behaviour Policy of Corby Technical School is for use during the arrangements for education of students in school during the Covid-19 partial re-opening. It is to be used in conjunction with, and read alongside, the Behaviour Management policy, Anti-Bullying policy and our Child Protection policy and E-safety.

Category	Dealt with by	Concern examples	Possible actions
1	Staff	Minor disrespect or inappropriate behaviour below the expectations of acceptable behaviour within school during normal operation. This could include rudeness, disrespect or not following instructions.	Conversation with student(s) which could include a verbal warning. Contact with parents/carers. Concern logged on system (SIMS). SLT informed.
2	SLT	Repeated instances of "1" or: A single use of offensive language (not towards staff). Abruptness towards staff. Unsafe behaviour during the partial closure (this could include not following instructions for social distancing – (2 metres distance).	Conversation(s) with student(s) which could include a final warning. Contact with student's parents/carers. Concern logged on system (SIMS). SLT informed.
3	SLT	Repeated instances of "2" or: A single use of offensive language towards staff. Inappropriate comment about any member of staff in school. Any use of racist, homophobic, bullying, discriminatory language/behaviour. Any comments towards a member of staff that could be construed as inappropriate or sexualised. Fighting Spitting The issue would normally result in a fixed termed exclusion.	Discussion with parent/carer (s). Logging of incidents on system (SIMS). Logging of incidents on safeguarding system (CPOMS) as applicable. If student behaviour is endangering the safety of others (e.g. <i>repeated failure to social distance, fighting, spitting</i>) and the student is deemed MORE 'at risk' studying at school, a temporary suspension from attending school will be considered. This would also be carried out in liaison with all relevant active agencies if applicable. On return an individual risk assessment must be implemented.
