Dear Parents/Carers,

Term three has been another great term at Corby Technical School where the school community has seen many successes and experienced a range of events together. Our students and staff all continue to work hard, support one another, and move forward together as part of our thriving community.

We were delighted to hold our Careers Fair this term and the event was supported by local businesses from a range of different industries. All students attended across the day and parents/carers had the opportunity to attend after school and discuss routes into the various sectors with employers. We received some excellent feedback from the exhibitors who were really impressed with our students. Our Careers Lead, Mrs Stevens also arranged a number of events this term for students across the school, including apprenticeship assemblies with Audi and Volkswagen and workshops with Lewis Silkin Law Firm who are based in London. In our assembly programme this term, we have also welcomed visiting speakers from Youthworks Northamptonshire who led assemblies on LGBTQ+ History month, focussing on protected characteristics, British Values and support groups available to students.

This week, we have been celebrating world book day with various activities around the school and in the library. One popular activity with Year 7 and 8 is that they have been decorating their form room doors in the style of their favourite book. Literacy is a golden thread that runs through our whole curriculum, and it is fantastic to see this being celebrated by staff and students alike. Year 10 Art students have taken part in a Graffiti workshop with Marvin Mudzongo from Lemon Pop and created some fabulous pieces. Year 11 students sat several assessments this term, including Spanish speaking assessments, and we are enormously pleased with the rapid progress that they are making ahead of their examinations. Year 11 Food Technology students have completed the practical element of their course and have produced some amazing dishes. They have all worked extremely hard and shown great commitment.

Last week we held our final sixth form open evening of the year. Our sixth form leadership team have been instrumental in presenting our provision from a student perspective and talked with passion about their experiences here.
