KEY INFORMATION

Collection of students from school:

Please can all parents/carers ensure that they park safely in our front car park at the end of the school day and ensure that they prioritise the safety of students in the car park by waiting patiently for students to cross the car park. We are happy to allow parents to use our car park for collection, but if this use compromises student safety we may have no choice but to close our gates.

Swipe Cards:

It is vital that your child has a swipe card, this records their attendance at school as well as being used to access school printers, for library loans and to pay for meals at break and lunch. Please ensure your child has a swipe card when we return to school after the two-week break, new cards can be ordered via Wisepay if required. Please note that students who do not present a card at mealtimes will be asked to speak with a designated member of staff and only a basic meal will be provided until such time that a new card is issued.

Punctuality:

The school day begins promptly at 8.45am. Our expectation is that students are in their classrooms and ready to engage in their learning by 8.40am. Arriving promptly makes sure that disruption to the learning is avoided, your child feels well prepared for the day, and they don't miss out on the personal development curriculum time. In order to work together with you to support your child in meeting this expectation, we will continue to implement our system of consequences and communication with home for students who arrive late to school.

Uniform:

Please ensure your child is wearing the correct uniform, students must wear black school shoes, trainers are not permitted. Further information regarding our uniform expectations can be found <a href="https://example.com/here-not/separations-com/

Please be reminded that if your child wishes to wear a jumper underneath their blazer, it must be a school branded jumper. These are available from our school uniform provider. However, please also note that it is sufficiently warm in school that a jumper is not required, and it is also possible to wear a plain white top under a shirt if this is your child's preference.

Equipment:

Students will need to ensure that they start the new term with their own personal stationery:

- scientific calculator (we recommend the Casio fx-83GT). This should be named.
- 2 black pens
- pencil
- rubber
- green pen (biro)
- glue stick

The school will provide any other stationery, but it remains the responsibility of each student to be fully prepared for lessons with this basic set of equipment.

Wisepay:

Please ensure your child has sufficient credit on their account to purchase breakfast and lunch in school. We are unable to contact parents during the school day should your child have insufficient funds.
