Re: Year 11 Drama Trip

Dear Parent/Carer,

As part of their GCSE course, Year 11 Drama students are required to evaluate a live theatre production. We are extremely excited that theatres have now re-opened their doors following the closures caused by the pandemic. We have managed to secure tickets for a fantastic production of 'The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-time' at Nottingham Theatre Royal on Friday 11th February at 7.30pm. The expectation is that all Drama students will attend as they will need to write about it in their exam. Additionally, it is a fantastic opportunity to visit a prestigious theatre and see a multi-award-winning production.

Students will remain on-site at the end of the school day. They will be given time to get changed out of school uniform and eat in the school restaurant, and then there will be an hour in which they will be taught how to approach live theatre evaluation.

We are asking for a voluntary contribution of £15, payable through WisePay. This will contribute towards their theatre ticket and travel to and from the venue via school minibus. We will depart from school at approximately 5.00pm and travel to the Theatre, we will return to Corby Technical School at approximately 12.00am, we will ask students to contact home with a more accurate time of arrival back at school when we are on the return journey. Students can be collected from school upon return.

Permission for your child to attend can be given via Wisepay where you can also make the voluntary contribution.

Students should bring:

- A notebook and pen for writing notes about the production.
- A packed lunch to eat after school/before leaving on the minibus.
- A small amount of money for drinks/snacks in the interval if they wish.
